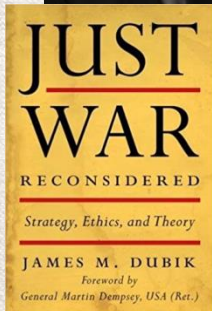

In *Just War Reconsidered: Strategy, Ethics, and Theory*, James M. Dubik draws on years of research as well as his own experiences as a soldier and teacher to fill the gaps left by other theorists. He applies moral philosophy, political philosophy, and strategic studies to historical and contemporary case studies to reveal the inaccuracies and moral bankruptcy that inform some of the literature on military ethics.

Lieutenant General Jim Dubik, Ph.D., Husband, father, grandfather; uncle, son, and brother; teacher; leader; innovator; retired army general; former infantryman, paratrooper, and ranger.

He earned a PhD in philosophy from the Johns Hopkins University. Published over 150 essays and monographs in a variety of publications (many available on either www.understandingwar.org or www.ausa.org). Co-Author, *Envisioning Future Warfare*. Board chairman, the Leadership Roundtable on Church Management; member, Council on Foreign Relations, the U.S. Army Ranger Hall of Fame, and distinguished member of the U.S. Army 75th Ranger Regiment; 2012-2013 General Omar N.
