Number 1 on the list is **CHICAGO**. If you're headed to the Windy City, we suggest that you visit **ST. CLEMENT CATHOLIC CHURCH** and **OLD ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH**. They offer a variety of faith and community building programs, plus many Mass times from which to choose throughout the week and on weekends.

Old St. Pats, one of the few buildings to survive the Great Chicago Fire of 1871, is located in the heart of downtown. Since its dedication on Christmas morning in 1856:

“St. Patrick’s has been a sacred site embodying the dreams and aspirations of hundreds of thousands of Chicagoans. In few neighborhoods have the bricks and mortar mattered so much.”

St. Clement, a welcoming Catholic community that accepts and encourages diversity, is located in Lincoln Park. The St. Clement outreach arm, Saint Clement Human Concerns Commission, “assures that all people are invited to be full participants in the church and in society.”

Recent grads will be interested in both parishes’ programs for single and married adults in their 20s and 30s.

St. Pat’s sponsors After Five, Service Saturday, Theology on Tap, Faith Sharing, and other special events. Their Resource Guide has everything you need to know about what parish members do and who they partner with in the community.

St. Clement offers lectures, workshops and concerts, art and special events in addition to many ministries and activities to help you get to know people and experience the support of the entire community.

If you're headed west of the Mississippi River, the Gateway City has a lot to offer! **St. Louis** was home to the 1904 World's Fair and is in the top 100 list of cities by quality of living in the world.

Young Catholic adults in St. Louis have two campus ministries from which to choose: **St. Francis Xavier College Church**, on the campus of St. Louis University, and the **Catholic Student Center at Washington University**.

St. Francis is open and inviting, a center not only for celebrations of sacramental mysteries, but also, "like the great medieval churches it recalls, a place where the arts, events in the life of the University, and every authentic human value will be at home."

The **Catholic Student Center at Washington University** was originally built in 1910 as a private residence by European craftsmen who stayed in St. Louis after the 1904 World's Fair. While the structure is 20th century, the center is a vibrant and active community for 21st century young adults.

St. Francis and the Catholic Student Center offer spiritual and social opportunities for young professionals, graduate students, and those studying at each campus' medical and law schools. Their programs are times to relax and have fun, and grow in faith.

You'll be at home in either church because as campus ministries, they will make you feel like you're back at St. John.

A beast of a city with energy and relentless Texas pride, **HOUSTON**'s economy has a broad industrial base in the energy, manufacturing, aeronautics, transportation, and health care sectors and is a leading center for building oilfield equipment; only New York City is home to more Fortune 500 company headquarters in the city limits.

The variety of ethnic Catholic Churches is a testimony to the city's diversity.

ST. MICHAEL CATHOLIC CHURCH, located near West Houston in the shadows of the Galleria, is a parish community of 4,500 households. The parish has programs in education and pastoral formation, as well as a vibrant social ministry outreach.

From the beginning, **ST. ANNE CATHOLIC COMMUNITY** was not only conceived as a place of prayer and worship, but also, like the great churches of the Middle Ages, as a beautiful structure which, in the wealth of its architectural features, would speak to the faithful of the wealth of their Christian heritage.

St. Michael Young Adult Club (SMYAC) is for adults aged 21-29. SMYAC offers members spiritual programs, special events, sports and community projects. They have large member turnouts at Welcome Wednesday and Thirsty Thursday events which are designed especially for new members to meet the rest of the group.

St. Anne Young Adults (age 21 and older) participate in a wide range of activities for a greater sense of community within the parish. Activities include community service, special events, sports leagues, movies, dinners, museums, and other recreational activities. The ninth-largest city in the US, **DALLAS**, is an ultra modern and sophisticated city, centrally located and within a four-hour flight from most North American destinations. Even though the city slogan is “Live large. Think big”, we’ve found two churches that offer faith communities that may be small but still think big.

HOLY TRINITY CATHOLIC CHURCH was founded as a mission church. The parish continues that tradition with lay ministries involved in service and outreach to the larger community. That aspect makes Holy Trinity seem “different” as a parish community, explaining why so many of its families come from outside the parish boundaries. Holy Trinity is, in many ways, still a mission church.

THE NEUHOFF CATHOLIC CENTER, located on the campus of Southern Methodist University serves the students, faculty, and staff of the university, and their extended community members. The university engages with the wider Dallas-Ft. Worth community in many areas, including spiritual development. The Pastor and staff of the Neuhoff Catholic Center strive to develop lifelong active Catholics who are challenged to investigate and remain involved in their faith.

Beyond Sunday is Holy Trinity’s community of young adults in their 20s and 30s. They share faith beyond Sunday Mass through spiritual and service activities. Their social activities include Late Night at the Museum, basketball, and new member events. Their full calendar of events is available on the church’s website.

The Neuhoff Catholic Center offers formation, lectures, and all kinds of special events for students and adults of all ages. You can attend daily Mass at the Center’s Chapel of the Annunciation and Sunday Masses at SMU’s Perkins Chapel.

They offer everything from parish based learning opportunities on current issues, retreats and an inspiring liturgy, to the Young Adult Christmas Celebration, Winter-fest, Mardi Gras Dinner Dance, Spirits and Wisdom, lunches, happy hours, camping and ski trips. At St. Raphael, there is truly something for everyone!

The **CATHOLIC COMMUNITY OF ST. THOMAS MORE**, also located in Chapel Hill, strives to provide parishioners with a variety of programs and a social structure that brings parishioners together in prayer, service, celebration and play. The number of ministries and groups in the parish has flourished to meet the needs of its 2,900 parishioners.

St. Thomas More's young adult ministry, "**Young Spirits**" fosters a sense of community for Catholics in their 20s and 30s.
